FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY

In 1587, Filipinos first landed in Morro Bay, Calif. In 1763, Filipino seamen established a settlement in what is now known as New Orleans, La. The Spanish-American War established Filipinos as “nationals” in the United States. From the early 1900s through 1935, they were free to enter the United States as long as they could purchase a boat ticket.

tana, the railroads, kitchens, and restaurants. We must understand the lives of the postal workers, houseboys, the American-born second generation of pre-World War II days, war brides and countless other who constitute the subsequent groups of immigrants from the Philippines.

FANHS Hampton Roads seeks to highlight post-1965 Filipino immigration to the area including the experiences of the men who enlisted in the United States Navy, the women who served as nurses, and the changing family dynamics on which the community was built.

- There are 19 chapters throughout 22 states in the United States



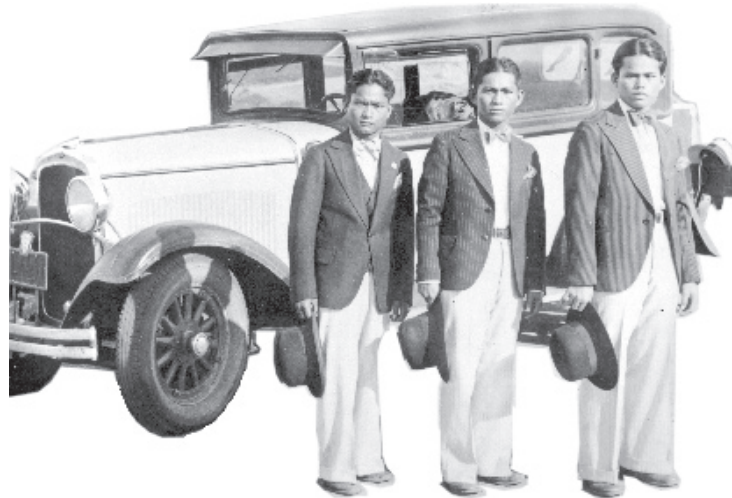
